SEND at Moat Farm Infant and Nursery School

How do we identify children who may have an SEN need? EYFS

- Prior to entry to Nursery, Natalie Skidmore (Assistant Head Teacher for SEND) visits settings/ homes to talk to staff/parents and observe the children; information on SEND is shared at this point and any action needed is taken. Staff may identify children with SEND by information received from the parents or Early Years Inclusion Support. Early Years Intervention Grant would be applied for and in place for the child's entry to nursery or shortly after. This is reapplied for every 12 weeks.
- Prior to entry to Reception Natalie
 Skidmore (Assistant Head Teacher for
 SEND) visits settings to talk to staff
 and observe the children; information
 on SEND is shared at this point and
 any action needed is taken. Children
 who have received 7 ½ hours or more
 Early Years Intervention Grant
 funding will have double this support
 funded for their first two terms in
 Reception. During this time a CAM
 may be held to request an EHCP.

SEND at Moat Farm Infant and Nursery School

<u>KSI</u>

In year one and two assessment data is used to highlight any concerns about a pupil's progress and this is discussed at pupil progress meetings. This information is then discussed at a meeting with myself (SENCO) and each class teacher, we discuss the possible reasons for the lack of progress and use our whole school provision map to select the most appropriate intervention to address the child's needs. Any child who has followed a number of interventions and is still not making progress may be referred to Inclusion Support for a formal assessment of their needs.

What specific expertise is available to children with SEN?

- High quality first teaching
- 1 − 1 direct teaching
- Staff trained as Better Reading Partners (BRP)
- Staff trained in Fischer Family Trust reading and writing interventions
- Staff trained in Numeracy interventions
- Staff trained in Makaton and PECs
- Staff trained in Autism
- All staff delivering other interventions are appropriately trained
- Team Teach intervention
- Talk Boost
- Wellcomm language intervention
- Specialist equipment e.g. physiotherapy balls, writing slopes
- Personalised behaviour charts
