Regular attendance is vital for your child's progress and development. Being present in school not only ensures that they do not miss out on valuable learning opportunities, but also helps them build social skills and form lasting friendships. Being on time to school is also very important, our class doors open at 8.30am to allow families 20 minutes to get children into school on time. Please arrive on time so children can enter through their classroom door instead of coming in through the school office. Your child will be bringing home their attendance register print out for the Autumn Term for you to see this week.

If your child has a medical appointment during the school day, you need to provide a copy of the appointment letter/text of this to the office so the absence can be authorised as M for medical appointment on the register.

In the coming term, we will continue to promote good attendance with a new incentive for each class to work towards together. More details about this will be shared in the next newsletter!

School Nursery

School Nursery offers places to 2, 3 and 4-year olds as follows:

- <u>30 hour</u> funded places for 3 and 4-year olds (8:45 3:00) you can apply for the eligibility code on this website. www.childcarechoices.gov.uk
- <u>15 hour</u> funded places for all 3 and 4-year-old children children may start with us the term after they turn 3 (8:30 11:30am or 12 3pm)
- <u>15 hour</u> funded places for eligible 2-year olds (12 3pm everyday) From April 2024 eligible working families will be able to get 15 hours free places. You can apply for the eligibility code on this website free childcare for 2 year olds <u>www.childcarechoices.gov.uk</u>





Reminders


- Parking: I'd like to remind parents to park responsibly and safely when dropping children off at school and when collecting them at the end of the day. The safety of our children is paramount and your co-operation is appreciated. Can I also remind parents that we are only allowed to park on Tesco car park when you are shopping there. Please ensure that you are not blocking any driveways, so that we can remain considerate of our local residents. If you do have any concerns regarding parking please contact Sandwell Council.
- Named clothing: Can I remind parents to ensure that all children's clothing is clearly named to avoid 'mix-ups' with uniform. We have a full box of lost property in school so if you are missing some of your child's school uniform, please ask at the office or the class teachers if you can come in and look through this box.
- **Reporting absence:** If your child is absent from school you must telephone the school office before 9.30am to report this absence. You can choose option 1 to report the absence on the answerphone at any time or you can speak to one of the lovely ladies in the office from 8am. Please ensure that you state your child's name and class and the reason for the absence, giving as much detail as possible.
- **Play equipment in the playgrounds:** Please do not let your children use the climbing frames and trim trails before and after school. This equipment is for use by the children during playtimes and lunchtimes only.








Parent Feedback survey Autumn 2023


Results from the 2023 Autumn term Parent Consultations

Who am I?

My name is Jackie L'Herroux and I am retired. I have been a Governor at Moat Farm Infant School since 2018.

My Background

until recently I lived in Sandwell. I was brought up here, educated here, worked here. Before my retirement in 2020 I worked in education and visited Moat Farm Infants many times. I have two children and four grandchildren.



Why do I like being a governor?

I like being a Governor at Moat Farm Infants because it allows me the opportunity to be part of a school where everyone works towards ensuring that the pupils here have a safe, secure and an enjoyable start to their education. Experiences throughout my life mean that I can participate in the governance of MFI with confidence, knowledge and care.

Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

If your child is eligible for benefit related free school meals and you register them for this, school will receive extra funding called 'pupil premium'. We use this extra money to improve the educational provision and resources in school. Families also receive weekly £15 per child food vouchers during the school holidays. Families who are eligible for free school meals may also register children with the 'Holiday Activities and Food' HAF Sandwell scheme to gain access to free activities during the school holidays. What is pupil premium funding?

Pupil premium funding from the government is given to schools to help pupils reach their full potential, regardless of their background or financial situation. School will get an extra £1,385 for every eligible pupil who is registered for free school meals. This extra money can make a real difference to the funding we receive from the government. It's provided for pupils who:

- Are registered for free school meals (this is different from the universal free meals funding scheme for all Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils)
- Have been registered for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years
- Are, or have been, in care
- Have parents in the armed forces

Your child might be eligible if you access:

- Income Support
- Income-based jobseeker's allowance or employment and support allowance
- Support under the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and you have an annual gross income
 of no more than £16, 190
- Universal credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

You can apply for free school meals via the Sandwell Council Website Free school meals | Sandwell Council or alternatively you can complete a form in school and we can apply for you. These forms are available from the school office.

Asthma Friendly School

I am delighted to inform you that our recent application to become a Black Country Asthma Friendly School has been successful and we have been awarded <u>Asthma Friendly School status</u>! This award recognises that our school is a safe and welcoming place for children with asthma.

In an Asthma Friendly School, children with asthma can expect:

- Their school to have an asthma policy
- Staff to have a good understanding of asthma
- To be able to access their reliever inhaler at all times
- Staff are able to help them if they are having an asthma attack
